relatively late-developing full understanding of gender constancy, the gender schema theorists argue that it is the early cognitive processes underlying children's ability to label themselves as boys or girls that play the key role in gender development (Martin et al., 2002).

Gender schema theory was introduced by psychologist Sandra Bem in 1981 and asserted that children learn about male and female roles from the culture in which they live. According to the theory, children adjust their behavior to align with the gender norms of their culture from the earliest stages of social development. 1

## **Social Cognitive Theory: Definition and Examples**

From a vast array of gendered cues in their social worlds, children quickly form an impressive

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constellation of gender cognitions, including gender self-conceptions (gender identity) and gender stereotypes. Cognitive perspectives on gender development (i.e., cognitive developmental theory and gender-schema theory) assume that children actively search for ways to make sense of the social world that surrounds them.

According to cognitive developmental theory, gender identity is postulated as the basic organizer and regulator of children's gender learning (Kohlberg, 1966). Children develop the stereotypic conceptions of gender from what they see and hear around them.
