Within England, London is the most ethnically diverse region, having the highest amount of heritage from 17 of the 26 regions analysed. Yorkshire was found to have the highest percentage of British (Anglo Saxon) ancestry (41.17%). The East Midlands has the most Scandinavian ancestry (10.37%) as well as the most Eastern European (2.47%).
