Primary and secondary education. Primary and secondary schools are the second level of education. Your child's education is free between the ages of 5 and 19 at state schools (schools that are government owned and funded) if they're a New Zealand citizen or a permanent resident. Schooling is compulsory from age 6-16.

New Zealand is fostering policies to fight dropout in upper secondary education, as the completion rate is 18 percentage points below the OECD average. At age 16 (year 11), students have flexibility to choose subjects of the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) based on their interest and ability.

NCEA (the National Certificate of Educational Achievement) is the main secondary school qualification in New Zealand. NCEA is actually three certificates: it can be awarded at Levels 1, 2 and 3. Students usually begin studying for their NCEA Level 1 in Year 11 and continue through Years 12 and 13 (from ages 15 through to 18).

In 1940, there were 156 schools in New Zealand offering secondary education: 39 secondary schools, 96 district high schools, and 21 technical high schools.
