Open-pollinated and heirloom plants both grow true to seed for years to come. Open-pollinated varieties are more genetically diverse, allowing them to better adapt to specific growing conditions.

To save seed is to participate in the process of natural selection. If you save seed only from the biggest tomato of the bunch and replant them year after year, you'll eventually end up with seeds that produce plants on which all the tomatoes are bigger.
